

MAKING DISCIPLE-MAKERS (4)

LIFE-COMMITTED AND PERSONAL

(MATTHEW 28:16-20)

1. Read Matthew 28:16-20 (page 1007). What has this passage thus far taught us?

2. What is the scope of disciple-making, according to the first half of verse 19? How might such scope be pursued in practice?

3. What might making disciple-makers look like in the course of an ordinary Christian's life? What does the making of disciple-makers demand of Christian believers? What will be the result if Jesus' Great Commission command is widely obeyed?

4. What method does Jesus command in verse 19 for the making of disciple-makers? What does Christian baptism symbolize, according to Romans 6:3-4? What does Jesus therefore mean by commanding baptism as the means of making disciple-makers?

5. What does Jesus mean by "name" in verse 19? What significance does this place upon the making of disciple-makers?

6. How does the Holy Trinity relate to the making of disciple-makers?

7. According to verse 20, how are makers of disciple-makers to be made? What exactly is to be taught, according to verse 20?

8. What does Jesus mean by the last sentence of verse 20? How does it encourage the making of disciple-makers?
