TO BE SERVED

- 1. <u>Read Genesis 3:1-6</u>. What incentives tempted the fall of humankind in Genesis 3:1-6? Which was the most significant? What has been the tendency of human-beings ever since? How is this shown today?
- 2. <u>Read Mark 10:32-45</u>. What lies behind the request of James and John in v37? Why does Mark record it after vv32-34? Who are James and John seeking to serve? What effect does their request have on the other disciples (v41)? Why?
- 3. What is Jesus describing in v42? And what is he teaching about it (v43a)? What is greatness according to Jesus? Why is this strange to us?

TO SERVE

- 4. What makes someone great, according to v43b? And what would make someone greater than everyone else, according to v44? Why?
- 5. Why might v45 be regarded as the summary verse of Mark's Gospel? What does it suggest about Mark's Gospel? Where, according to Jesus, is true status to be found in being served, or in serving? Does our world recognize this?
- 6. What contrast is being drawn in v45? What is taught about Jesus' service? What does this teach us about true service?

APPLICATION

- 7. What will we be always tempted to do in our Christian 'service'? But what should we truly do? And what will genuine service always require of us?
- 8. What spiritual checklist should we now apply to our areas of Christian service?
